- Long telephone answering times
- * Reception staff asking for the reason for the visit

Although the practice is temporarily understaffed it was suggested that more use could be made of the online services; where patients can book appointments or order repeat prescriptions.

The service is available online at www.kidsgrovemedicalcentre.co. uk. There is a simple registration process.

It was agreed that appointments are more readily available if patients are flexible about the doctor seen.

Now that patients records are online any of the doctors are able to access patients notes and previous history.

New "cancellation line" signs of being a positive move forwards.

* Since the new cancellation telephone option has been active the number of doctors appointments missed without cancellation has dropped significantly.

It was explained that telephone reception staff are trying to direct the patient to the most appropriate nurse or doctor when they ask for the reason for an appointment. This is an optional question and can be declined.

National GP News GP crisis

GPonline warned in November that 5m patients in England could be forced to look for a new practice because one in 10 GPs said their practice was at risk of being forced to close over the coming year.

The BMA's Urgent Prescription for General Practice At the centre of the BMA's drive to address the problems facing general practice has been the Urgent Prescription for General Practice campaign. The key asks for the campaign are:

- ♦ Safe, manageable workload
- More time with patients
- ♦ Increased practice funding
- More staff to support GPs
- Less box ticking

Data on GP practice populations released by NHS Digital in January list just 7,532 GP practices - down 181 from the total a year earlier in January 2016.

Part of the drop in GP practice numbers in the NHS Digital data is likely to be driven by mergers, which could mean that some of the practice locations no longer listed in official figures remain open, but under the wing of a larger group.

However, BMA leaders have warned that closures are at 'record levels' and the latest figures suggest that the trend is not slowing down as GPs wait for government pledges of investment through the *GP Forward View* to take effect.
